Craig Robertson – High Performance Badminton Coach has worked with BadmintonScotland on the Junior High Performance Programme and supported Area and Scottish Institute of Sport Programmes. He spent time as a self employed coach and lived in Denmark, while playing for Lillerød Badminton Club. Qualified as an Advanced Coach, Craig is also a Coach Tutor and worked for Glasgow City Council as Racquet Sports Development Officer.

Craig started playing in Fauldhouse Community Centre at age 11 and has represented Scotland's National Junior Teams at all age levels prior to becoming a Senior Internationalist and gaining 76 International Caps. Craig competed in the Thomas Cup, European, World Championships and the Commonwealth Games, where he won a Bronze Medal in the Badminton Team event in Manchester 2002. Other playing achievements include Men's Doubles champion at the Austrian Open in 1998 and at the Irish Open in 2000. Domestically he has won Scottish Invitation Singles, Scottish National Men's Doubles and Mixed Doubles titles.



As an active senior player Craig has won the over 40 and 45 Mens Doubles Titles at the Scottish International Seniors Championships and National Titles at both Scottish Masters and Seniors events in singles, doubles and mixed.

In 2010 Craig was part of a delegation that visited Zambia to arrange a pre-Olympic Training Camp 2012 for their National teams and led the badminton camp in Glasgow which involved preparation of Zambian players for the All African Games.

More recently Craig travelled to the Chinese city of Dalian to organise a twin city exchange with Glasgow and spent time travelling through three major cities and discovering badminton programmes in China.

Craig has an HND in Sports Coaching with Development and a BSc in Sports Studies from the University of Paisley.

Lena has been coaching badminton full time for 17 years and has an HND in Sports Coaching with Development and a Bsc in Sports Studies from University of Paisley, she also has an Advanced Level coaching qualification from BadmintonScotland.

Lena worked as a National Squad Coach for U15 and U19 age groups, over a period of 9 years and during this time was part of the coaching team for the UK School Games team in 2008. Lena is currently the Head Coach of Glasgow Satellite Squad/Talent Squad and has held this position since 2010, she was also Head Coach of Ayrshire Satellite Squad for 3 years.

Lena is a qualified Sport Scotland Coach Education Tutor and Assessor and currently tutors and assesses UKCC Level 1 and Level 2 courses.

In addition Lena is qualified to tutor and assess BadmintonScotland Level 1 Advanced coaching qualification.



As part of the Glasgow School of Sport curriculum, pupils undertake a Sport Education programme. As part of this programme pupils cover subjects such as Introduction to
